How do the words of the Risen Christ relate to what we read at Isaiah 49:6? (see Matthew 28:16-20; Luke 24:44-49; John 20:21; Acts 1:8)

At Deuteronomy 7:6 God speaks to the Hebrew people through Moses and says, "For you are a people holy to the Lord your God; the Lord your God has chosen you out of all the peoples on earth to be his people, his treasured possession." In what way does the mission God gave the covenant people help make sense of their election as "God's chosen people?" (see Genesis 12:1-3 – God's word to Abram; Exodus 19:4-6 – God's word to Moses; the Book of Jonah)

How does the Apostle Peter make use of that imagery at 1 Peter 2:9-10 to describe the Christian Church?

If the Church of Christ is God's people, what is our mission today?

How can you personally participate in that great mission?
